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WHO WE ARE

The Alaska Railroad Corporation is a full-service railroad serving ports and communities throughout Southcentral and Interior Alaska. Primarily, we serve as regularly scheduled public transportation in these regions - it's been our commitment since 1923.

In the summer, the Alaska Railroad provides daily service to many Alaska destinations. Passengers seeking rail-only travel will find schedules and fares beginning on page 9, while travelers seeking to explore Alaska may be interested in our multi-day adventure packages (page 21) and day trips (page 41). Whatever your reason for riding the rails, we think you'll agree the views from our tracks are some of the most spectacular on earth.

WHERE WE GO

The Alaska Railroad travels along approximately 500 miles of track with three daily summer trains: the Coastal Classic to Seward, the Denali Star to Anchorage, Talkeetna, Denali and Fairbanks, and the Glacier Discovery to Whittier, Portage, Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop and Grandview. The Hurricane Turn Flagstop Train runs Thursday through Monday out of Talkeetna during the summer, serving remote homes only accessible by rail.

During non-summer months, the Aurora Winter Train provides service between Anchorage and Fairbanks on weekends and select mid-week departures. The Hurricane Turn winter service runs once a month from Anchorage to Hurricane on the first Thursday of the month.

› Milepost 44 | TRAIL GLACIER

Great views of Trail Glacier, Trail Creek & Trail Canyon.

› Milepost 45 | GRANDVIEW

The site of a roadhouse for railroad workers. Named for the spectacular views of this alpine meadow in the Kenai Mountains.

› Milepost 48 | BARTLETT GLACIER

Named after Frank Bartlett, an Alaska Railroad engineer, the glacier is visible just beyond a curve in the tracks.

› Milepost 55 | SPENCER GLACIER

This magnificent wall of ice rises into view from our tracks. Countless adventure activities await you at Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop (see page 47).

› Milepost 224 | ALASKA RANGE

Here you can see a stunning view of Denali (20,320 ft.), Mount Hunter (14,960 ft.), Mount Foraker (17,400 ft.), Mount Russell (11,600 ft.) and Mount Dall (9,000 ft.). This is also home to the confluence of three major rivers: Talkeetna, Chulitna and Susitna.

› Milepost 284 | HURRICANE GULCH

One of the line's best photo vantage points, the bridge spans 918 feet - 296 feet above the creek.

› Milepost 304 | BROAD PASS

The lowest pass in the Alaska Range.

› Milepost 313 | SUMMIT

The summit of the Continental Divide is at 2,363 feet. Summit Lake drains into both the Pacific Ocean and Bering Sea.

› Milepost 348 | DENALI PARK

This milepost marks the entrance to Denali National Park, home to North America's highest mountain peak, Denali.

› Milepost 414 | MEARS MEMORIAL BRIDGE

This 700 foot mass of steel is one of the longest single-span bridges in the world. Dedicated by President Warren G. Harding - who in 1923 drove the final (golden) spike - it marks the completion of the Alaska Railroad. If you look below, you can see Athabascan fish wheels in the Tanana River.

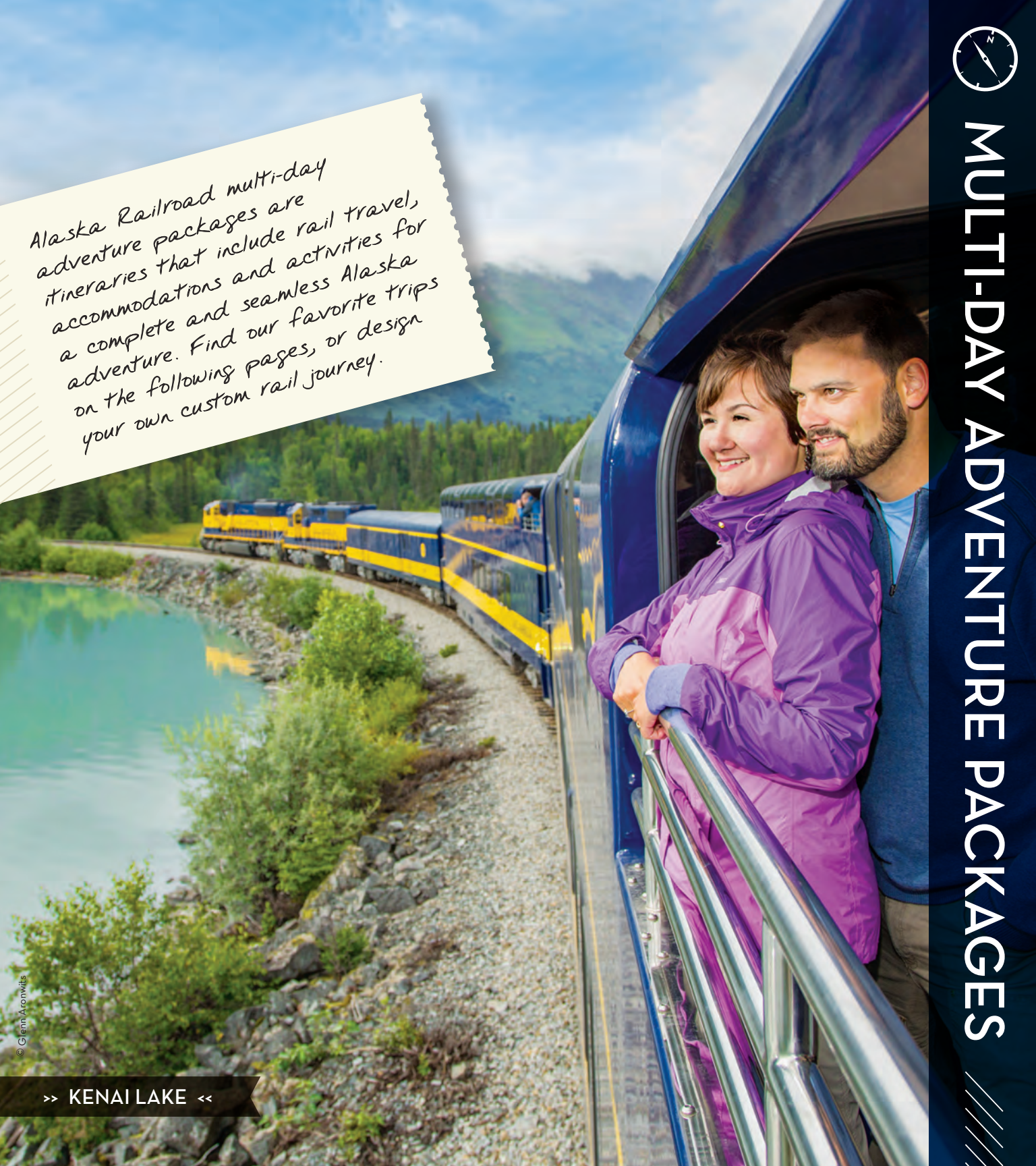
BAGGAGE

>> BROAD PASS <<

DAY 1 – Arrive in **Anchorage** and overnight. Plan to arrive early to explore Alaska's largest city and to get a good night's sleep before tomorrow's early rail journey.

DAY 2 – Travel south on the Coastal Classic Train to **Seward** and take in the spectacular scenery. Embark on a Resurrection Bay Wildlife Cruise and enjoy an all-you-can-eat salmon and prime rib buffet lunch. Overnight in Seward.

DAY 3 – Today, enjoy the Real Alaska Tour (page 56), including a dog sled ride, lunch at an Alaska roadhouse and a tour of Exit Glacier. Depart for Anchorage aboard the Coastal Classic Train. Watch for moose. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 4 – Depart for **Talkeetna** aboard the Denali Star Train. In Talkeetna, experience a thrilling 3.5-hour guided river jetboat safari traversing three different rivers. Overnight at the Talkeetna Alaskan Lodge.

Optional Talkeetna Add-on: Denali Flightseeing (see page 58).

DAY 5 – Journey to **Denali National Park** aboard the Denali Star Train. Enjoy an evening of rip-roarin' entertainment and hearty grub at Alaska Cabin Nite Dinner Theater. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 6 – Embark on the Tundra Wilderness Tour, a 6- to 8-hour bus tour of Denali National Park. Wildlife sightings are common, so keep your camera handy. Overnight in Denali.

Optional Denali Tour Upgrade: Kantishna Experience (see page 59).

DAY 7 – The morning is yours to explore and shop in Denali. Later, take the Denali Star to **Fairbanks**. Overnight in Fairbanks.

Optional Denali Add-on: Denali Helicopter Flightseeing, River Rafting, Husky Homestead Tour, Tundra Golf, Horse Drawn Covered Wagon Ride (see pages 59-60).

DAY 8 – Take a tour on the Riverboat Discovery, a historic sternwheeler, for a glimpse of life in Interior Alaska. See dog sledding, an Alaska Indian village and much more. Overnight in Fairbanks.

Optional Fairbanks Add-on: Arctic Circle Air Adventure (see page 60).

DAY 9 – A historical Fairbanks City Tour treats you to the University of Alaska, Museum of the North, the trans-Alaska pipeline and more. Later, fly to Anchorage via Ravn Alaska. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 10 – Depart for **Whittier** and Prince William Sound on the Glacier Discovery Train. Enjoy the 26 Glacier Cruise and see immense tidewater glaciers. Return to Anchorage and overnight.

Optional Anchorage Add-on: Opt to spend another day in Anchorage. Fly to Redoubt Bay to go Bear Viewing (see page 55) or shop and enjoy Anchorage's culinary scene.

GLACIERS, RAILS & TRAILS

Available late May – late August

DAY 1 - Arrive in **Anchorage**, Alaska's largest city. Book an excursion, or explore shops, museums and restaurants at your leisure. Overnight in Anchorage.

DAY 2 - Depart on the Glacier Discovery Train for the Alaska Wildlife Conservation Center, home to bears, moose and more. Continue on to the Spencer Glacier Whistle Stop, where you'll raft amid icebergs in full view of **Spencer Glacier**. Travel to Girdwood and overnight at the Hotel Alyeska.

DAY 3 - Enjoy spectacular views of backcountry glaciers aboard the Coastal Classic Train to the charming port town of **Seward**. Travel by boat to your home for the evening: the island getaway of the Kenai Fjords Wilderness Lodge.

DAY 4 - Watch for wildlife and glaciers aboard a day cruise of stunning **Resurrection Bay**. Upon your return to Seward, board the Coastal Classic Train for a late evening arrival into Anchorage.

DAY 5 - Travel to **Denali National Park** aboard the Denali Star Train. This scenic, full-day trip from Anchorage offers chances for views of Denali along with wildlife and backcountry beauty. The late afternoon arrival at the Park leaves time for exploration. Overnight in Denali.

DAY 6 - Watch for wildlife and incredible views as you travel 92 miles into the farthest reaches of the Park on the famed Park Road. Spend the night at the Denali Backcountry Lodge.

DAY 7 - This day is completely dedicated to enjoying the Denali backcountry, with options to hike, pan for gold, fish for grayling, mountain bike or just relax. Overnight at the Denali Backcountry Lodge.

DAY 8 - After a hearty breakfast, guests return to the Denali Train Depot for the short train trip to **Talkeetna**. This funky little village is known for its spectacular views of Denali. Arrive late in the afternoon and stretch your legs with a guided hike, spotting wildlife and learning about old-growth forest.

DAY 9 - In Talkeetna, a jetboat ride takes you deep into the National Wild River Park of Devil's Gorge. Depart on the Denali Star Train for the final leg from Talkeetna to Anchorage, arriving in the evening. Overnight in Anchorage.

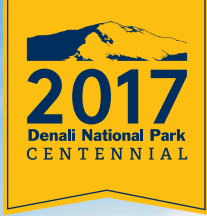

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

PAYMENT: Full payment is required within 72 hours of booking. We accept VISA, MC, Discover and American Express cards.

LATE BOOKINGS: Package bookings that are made within 35 days require a minimum of 24 hours to confirm availability. Full payment is required at the time of booking.

REFUNDS: "Multi-Day Adventure Packages" and "Day Tours" that are canceled 36 or more days before travel will be refunded 90% of the booking value. No refunds will be issued 35 or less days before travel. No refunds will be issued for unused services. The Glaciers, Rails & Trails package is subject to a 36 - 59 day cancellation fee of 50%.

Rail-only bookings that are canceled one (1) or more days before travel will be refunded 90% of the booking value. No refunds will be issued the day of travel.

CHANGE FEES: All paid bookings are subject to a 10% change fee. Changes are allowed on packages up to 36 days before travel and on rail-only bookings up to one day prior to travel. TRAVEL INSURANCE: We strongly recommend that you purchase trip cancellation insurance so you can plan your travel with complete peace of mind. Ask your Alaska Railroad reservations agent for a travel insurance quote and about the available plans.

CHECK-IN: Plan to check in one hour prior to the scheduled departure time. Reservations and seat assignments may be altered or reassigned if passenger and baggage are not checked in 15 minutes prior to scheduled departure. The Transportation Security Administration requires that any Alaska Railroad passenger 18 years of age or older present a government issued photo ID, or two forms of ID, one of which must be issued by a government authority. Children under the age of 16 may only travel in the company of an adult 18 years or older.

BAGGAGE: Alaska Railroad passengers are allowed two pieces of checked baggage and one carry-on. Two extra pieces of baggage (for a total of four) may be checked for an additional fee. No single piece may weigh over 50 lbs. A special handling fee of \$20 per bag applies to oversized bags, bicycles, animals checked in the baggage car and other recreational equipment. Firearms may be transported only as

checked baggage and must be either disassembled (slide or bolt removed) or have a lock (trigger or cable type) installed to prevent operation, and must be in a locked case. Concealed weapons are not permitted onboard. The Federal Railroad Administration regulates the transport of all types of camping stove fuels and/or motor fuels on passenger trains; camping fuels may be transported on the Glacier Discovery Train but must be checked with conductor at time of boarding.
